SLOW WATER DOWN

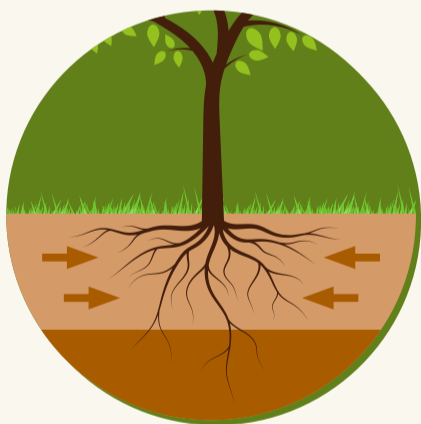
Rain soaks into the ground instead of rushing downhill towards streams and lakes.

HOLD THE LAND TOGETHER

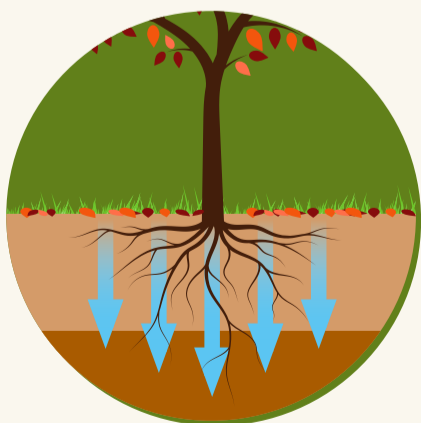
Roots hold the soil together keeping it out of waterways.

SUPPORT WILDLIFE

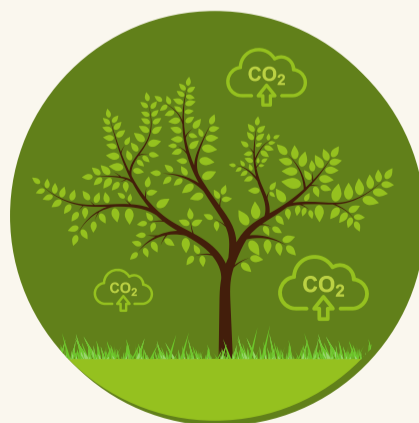
Natives create food and shelter for birds, insects, and other species. This variety keeps ecosystems healthy.
